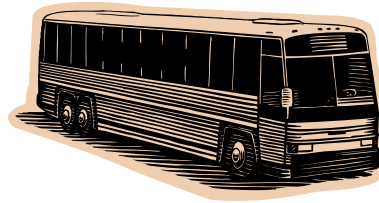


Optional Tours
